MARS-ALPHA PATTERN WARLORD TITAN HEAD

Owing its origins to the ancient days of the Age of Strife and the Mechanicum's domination of the red planet, the Mars-Alpha was perhaps the oldest and most widespread pattern of Battle Titan during the Great Crusade and the Horus Heresy. The secrets of this terrifyingly powerful war machine's construction were held on numerous major Forge Worlds such as Metalica and Anvillus as well as great Mars itself, and the Mars-Alpha Warlord formed the backbone of the Legio Titanicus.







Preparing the Model for Assembly


Before assembling the model, wash each part thoroughly with an abrasive brush, such as a toothbrush, to remove any model release agent that may still be on the surface of the parts. Then, remove any excess resin such as mould lines, casting gates, vents and shims. For a more detailed guide to working with resin models, go to the Downloads section of the Forge World website.


This kit contains all the pieces required to construct a Mars-Alpha pattern Warlord Titan Head. To glue the resin pieces together, use Citadel Super Glue.

NOTE: We have cast this kit using the most advanced techniques and the best quality resin, but due to the nature of the casting process, your model may contain small air bubbles. These can easily be filled with model filler or super glue. Any slight warpage of thin parts can easily be corrected by immersing the part in hot water for about 1 minute, then carefully bending it back into shape.






Use a pair of clippers to remove any vents and casting gates. The Working with Resin guide on the Forge World website goes into more detail about cleaning up resin components.


Right Face Plate



Left Face Plate


Painting


It is a good idea to paint the model at this stage as attaching the Face Plate assembly will obscure areas of the Cockpit interior, making the application of paint to those areas considerably more difficult. It is also easier to paint the crew members before inserting them into the Cockpit.




Slide the Face Plate assembly onto the Cockpit assembly.

The finished Face Plate assembly is attached to the Cockpit before the crew are added. This is to make sure that the crew do not obstruct mounting the Face Plate to the Cockpit.









Final Assembly

Once the Mars-Alpha pattern Warlord Titan Head and the Heraldic Shields have been painted, mount them onto the Warlord Titan's body as shown.

The Titan Princeps on foot is an additional model which can be used to represent the Princeps when he is not seated in the command throne of his Titan, and is not used in the Warlord Titan's head construction.
